Dam Committee

The Dam Committee has engaged the services of a trapper to remove the muskrats burrowing into the dam. Residents will be notified prior to trapping beginning. During the trapping period, you are asked to keep your dogs on a leash while walking on the dam side of the lake. While the majority of the traps will be in the water, you are still asked to

exercise caution since the trapper will be identifying burrows around the lake.

Environmental Committee

One of the items identified by the trapper hired to remove the muskrats was that the grasses growing along the dam side of the lake are contributing to muskrats choosing to build burrows in our dam. By removing the grasses, we will hopefully prevent the muskrats from returning.

The Committee has been given approval by the Board to purchase a special rake for removing the grasses and tarps to prevent future growth of invasive grasses. As weather permits, work will begin on grass removal.
